

Stone Hill School - Governors' Statement on Behaviour

The school promotes, recognises and rewards positive behaviour. The governors of Stone Hill School are committed to the principles that good behaviour of pupils is essential if effective learning is to take place and to:

- ensure the safety and wellbeing of all pupils
- ensure the safety and wellbeing of individual pupils
- ensure the safety and wellbeing of staff
- protect the environment
- divert a pupil from an inappropriate to an appropriate behaviour
- teach pupils that actions and choices have consequences
- allow pupils to develop and demonstrate positive abilities and attitudes

All teaching and non-teaching staff have an essential role to play in providing a good example to pupils. Positive relationships between adults and pupils will highlight the importance of MUTUAL respect, personal values and the necessity to work hard, listen and understand.

The school behaviour management policy will aim to provide a school community which promotes self-esteem, and encourages self-discipline and hence the personal desire to adhere to the school's high standards of work and behaviour.
